8. TIC Update (Mike)

The final report for DWR has been sent in. This was a good year for the overall program and things are on track for the upcoming year. As part of the report, I asked coordinators to submit; I asked for ideas on how to improve the program. The main two suggestions were: funding for equipment costs, and training for chapter coordinators to know how to assemble the equipment and troubleshoot problems that schools may have. I am going to try and organize a zoom type of meeting to help with those situations. The details are yet to be worked out.

The final tally of number of schools participating this past year is 208 not counting Mountain Empire Chapter which never provides any information or even feedback.

The TC Energy grant for TIC on behalf of State Council in the amount of \$15,000 over a three-year period was approved. We should receive the money in about a month. The

money will be used to help chapters schools with transportation costs for field trips and equipment replacement. I will work with Bill Pierce to set up a grant item within the TIC budget category. The grant protocol guidelines will follow the State Council's grant program. I hope to have the grant up and running by September 2024. Any schools requesting money will have to apply through their chapter's TIC Coordinator, which ensures a level of accountability. The announcement of the grant program will be forthcoming as soon as I receive the details and a contract from TC Energy. Jim Wilson, Bill Pierce and I will be working on details as I get them.

The TIC contact for the Rapidan Chapter, which is our biggest Chapter with 29 schools participating has resigned due to moving to the Charlottesville area. The Chapter is trying to recruit someone (hopefully two people) to take over. In the interim, Chuck Hoysa is temporarily fielding the duties.

I am gathering a list of schools from each Chapter that are participating this upcoming school year. I need counts for the egg distribution come mid-September to early October.

The revised TIC manual is nearly complete. I am formatting the final few chapters.
